

Making the Road to Recovery a Little Smoother


Families face a number of challenges when a child is recovering from a traumatic brain injury (TBI). One of the hurdles along the way is the transition from hospital or home care back into school.

Connecting to the Transition Team is simple. In fact, families don't have to do a thing. When a child is in need of services a medical referral is sent to Kent ISD who coordinates the team. We make the necessary contacts within the child's school and connect the student and their family with the appropriate team members.

What is traumatic brain injury?

Traumatic brain injury (TBI) is an injury to the brain caused by an external force. It can be caused by a blow to the head or body, or from an object penetrating the skull. A TBI may be caused by a vehicle accident, a fall, a sports injury, or other physical impact. Mild TBI may cause temporary issues while more serious TBI can result in long-term complications.
