

A regular meeting of the School Board of said district was held in the administrative offices on the above date. The meeting was called to order by President Haidle at 4:00 p.m.

President Haidle welcomed Early Childhood Director, Ashley Karsten, and Bright Beginnings Coordinator, Karen Lezan, to present on the impact of the Bright Beginnings Program. Kent ISD has offered Bright Beginnings services for the past 21 years. Services include home visits and playgroups for families from pregnancy until kindergarten age. In the past year, 2,677 home visits took place with over 50 playgroups a month located in all 20 local districts. The program has recently received grant funding through MDHHS for the Healthy Moms, Health Babies Expansion program to assist families who experience substance misuse. Board members were given the opportunity to ask questions and thanked Ms. Lezan for her presentation.

Assistant Superintendent Philipps shared the highlights from the fall budget resolutions. A significant change was the increase in property tax revenue originally estimated at 3% last spring that resulted in a 5.5% increase. This provided an additional \$2.7 million in revenue from property tax collections. Investment income was also amended from an original budget of \$175,000 to \$2 million, due to interest rates shifting from 0% to between 4-5%. State funded grants have also risen, providing an additional \$3 million in GSRP and Adult Education funds. Special Education funding was also amended due to the state budget creating a new categorical that provides 75 % reimbursement from the foundation allowance, in addition to the 28.6% cost reimbursement.

Expenditures show Medicaid distributions are up to \$3 million in conjunction with \$4 million in Special Ed Act 18 supplemental funds to be allocated to local districts this year. Hiring additional staff for CTE program instruction and counseling services also contribute to increased expenditures. Special Education and Career Technical Capital fund budgets were increased from the original estimate. This is due to additional construction work that was projected for the 2023-24 school year that has now been moved up to this fiscal year.

Approve the addition of one (1.0) FTE Safety & Security Department Supervisor.

Approve the resolution to amend the 2022-23 budget amendments.

Approve the purchase and installation of an audiology sound room from the Soundroom Experts in the amount of \$35,654.12.

Approve the 2022-23 KTC Handbook Revisions as outlined in the board packet

Approve the nominees for open Parent Advisory Special Education (P.A.S.E) seats for the 2022-2025 term.

Assistant Superintendent Rodgers shared the common calendar that has been reviewed by local superintendents and neighboring counties. This will provide a perpetual five-year calendar for district planning. The three-year renewal for a pre-Labor Day start was also approved by MDE.


Superintendent Koehler thanked the leadership team for their outstanding work throughout the strategic planning process this year and wished everyone a happy holiday.
