




# **Student Achievement**

#### M-STEP Proficiency

Students in grades 3-7 throughout Michigan complete the M-STEP each year (excluding 2019-2020). This assessment is meant to measure what students know based on Michigan's Academic Standards.

Students who meet or exceed academic content standards are rated as proficient or advanced.




The latest MSTEP scores show students in Kent ISD continue to outperform their peers across the state. In both Math and English Language Arts, student scores are improving and are roughly 1% below pre-pandemic proficiency levels.

#### **PSAT Proficiency**

The PSAT is a preliminary SAT test taken by 8th graders across the state each year (excluding 2019-2020). This assessment is meant to measure students' level of proficiency in Math and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing.

Students who meet or exceed academic content standards are rated as proficient or advanced.




In 2022-23, students in Kent ISD scored 1.35% higher in math proficiency than they did four years ago, and they continue to score higher in math than the state average.

Scores in Evidence-Based Reading & Writing for students in Kent ISD are nearly on-par with prepandemic proficiency, recovering at a faster rate than students across the state.

## **College Readiness**


The percentage of high school students across Kent ISD meeting College Readiness benchmarks in Math and English Language Arts has consistently outpaced the statewide average.



#### **Graduation Rate**

Kent ISD graduation rates have remained above the statewide rates for more than a decade, and beat the state average by more than 4 percentage points each year since 2018-19.

Districts throughout Kent ISD frequently work together to accomplish large-scale change, create new opportunities and meet student needs. The following pages highlight just a few of our collaborative initiatives.



Raising voices to drive school quality

The MI Student Voice survey is the first step in education leaders' vision to expand the definition of school quality beyond academic scores and to include feedback from students, parents and staff into school quality ratings.

Developed by local school leaders in 2019, the survey gauges student engagement, social-emotional learning and belonging, and provides a holistic picture of students' educational experience.

Thanks to grant support from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund, in the 2022-2023 school year, the survey grew to reach students in 58 districts across the state and moved one step closer to fulfilling the vision.

Because engaged students are 2.5 times more likely to say they do well in school and 4.5 times more likely to be hopeful for their future.

#### **Social Emotional Learning**


Because students need to build character, values and mindsets for success later in life

# 2023 Findings

- There are gaps in social-emotional learning with differences based on gender and race.
- Roughly 1 in 5 students have low social-emotional learning.
- Engagement is highest in elementary grades and drops as students progress through grades.
- Growth mindset, the idea that students are capable of anything, is also highest in elementary grades.
- A sense of belonging at school is highest for elementary students.



Michigan's effort to increase the numbers of working-age adults with a skill certificate or college degree to 60% by the year 2030 is fittingly called Sixty by 30.

Because schools and educators play a key role in helping young people explore future options and develop educational and career paths, Kent ISD has been tasked with leading <u>Sixty by 30</u> efforts in Kent County. Our schools are honored to take on this challenge for our community and look forward to boosting Michigan's future workforce through new and existing opportunities.



<u>CareerPrep 2030</u> is a collaboration to identify and expand career awareness and preparation opportunities for students focused on career pathways and expanding Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. This effort brings together local educators, business, community and non-profit leaders, harnessing and leveraging their collective ideas and knowledge in the interest of preparing students for careers and meeting the economic needs of our region.



The <u>Student Leadership Community</u> provides a forum for students to give input and share ideas to help better the educational experience for all local students. Members participate in leadership activities, media interviews and special events where their voices can be heard. The group of 45 high school students come from across Kent ISD's 20 school districts, public school academies and Kent Career Tech Center.









This innovative initiative from Kent, Muskegon and Ottawa Area ISDs and the districts within them, in partnership with Grand Valley State University, recruits, trains and supports aspiring teachers helping to fill the talent gap and ensure every student has an excellent teacher.

Thanks in part to a grant from the Michigan Department of Education, <u>West Michigan Teacher Collaborative</u> will create pathways for 300 existing and aspiring educators to obtain advanced credentials or earn a teaching degree, with many participants receiving a stipend up to \$20,000.



Your Dream is Our Dream showcases student success stories featuring interviews with and stories of students from across the area who are succeeding at every level from early childhood programs to pre-K, K-12, and Adult Ed, along with the educators who are helping them reach their dreams and goals. These student stories are shared on social media, in the Your Dream is Our Dream podcast produced in partnership with WGVU, and on School News Network.



Celebrating 10 years of providing a window into the public schools of Kent ISD, <u>School News Network</u> specializes in sharing the stories of our schools. The experienced team of professional multi-media journalists covers classroom teaching and learning, analyzes the many issues that enhance or discourage student success, and highlights the magic that happens each day in our schools.






