### START Update

- Spring RCN Leadership Day May 1, 2018 at Kellogg Center in Lansing. Agenda recently added to START website. Seven committee members attending.
- RCN Pacing Guide has been updated to include dates for 2017-2018 deadlines. Things are going well. Next month
  an end-of-year summary for Evidence-Based Practice and Peer-to-Peer will be presented by our committee
  members. Team applications for 2018-2019 Early Childhood, BYF, and K-12 are now available. There is interest in
  Kent applying for both K-12 and Early Childhood to be a host site for 2019-20 school year. Stay tuned!

#### Kent CAN/Kent ISD Updates

- Review 2017-2018 Contract Goals and Target Students
  - Peer to Peer district reporting Rebecca McIntyre. Rebecca sent out emails and she is getting good responses for the necessary information for the grant. The email was sent out to directors and peer-to-peer contact at buildings and the information is coming in. Rebecca was able to check with committee members and finalize almost all of the necessary information at this meeting.
- Peer to Peer Day at the Ballpark May 23<sup>rd</sup>. One hundred and forty-three tickets were ordered for this school year. Details regarding times and location of seating will be coming. Caledonia, Grandville, Kentwood and Kenowa Hills will be participating this year. (The White Caps management has guaranteed a sunny, dry day but could not guarantee a White Caps win!)
- KCTC Samsung Solve for Tomorrow update and voting through April 2<sup>nd</sup> KCTC is in the running for the grand prize. Everyone is encourage to vote once a day until April 2<sup>nd</sup> www.samsung.com/us/solvefortomorrow (flyer is attached).
- State Autism Council Update: Rebecca McIntyre and Lindsey Nicholson attended the meeting. Michigan Medicaid pieces ABA directory is now available listed by county. Can be downloaded and disseminated as necessary. As of February 1st 5,287 youths received approved ABA services. Good information is available and attached to the minutes. Save-the-Date: Project ImPACT: Teaching Social Communication to Children with Autism will be held on May 21-22, 2018 with Dr. Brooke Ingersoll. Kent County has been chosen as a Demonstration Model Site for MDHHS to work with CMHSP to pilot a full physical and behavioral health integrated service demonstration model.

April 27<sup>th</sup> is the next meeting of this committee and Rebecca encourages anyone to come along with her to attend this meeting. It is very educational and we are so pleased that Rebecca is on this committee. (See attachment for details on the March 2018 Council Update).

#### Presentations:

Visual Supports: Presentation – Kindy Segovia and Suzanna Ruskusky presented on this very broad topic. Suzy attended the AltShift conference which was near Detroit and was pleased with what was presented. Suzy showed was is being done at Ottawa Area ISD. Students are able to make their own visual schedules. Some great ideas were presented.
